Cardiology: Fascinating and Rewarding Career Choice

Over 70 million U.S. citizens live with a cardiovascular disease. Heart disease and stroke are the first and third leading causes of death in both women and men in this country, with 927,000 lives lost each year. Cardiovascular disease is also the leading cause of death in African-American men and women, claiming 100,000 lives annually. Although these conditions are highly preventable through certain lifestyle practices, the risk of a person being diagnosed with a heart disease and stroke are the most common cardiovascular diseases, however there are many other conditions that can have serious, and possibly fatal, effects on a person's body.

"It's an exciting time to be a cardiologist," said Daniel Courtade, MD, FACC, president of Northern Kentucky Heart, located in Crestview Hills. "I have developed skills I never dreamed of through the advances in technology to fix the heart. The medications being developed are also making a positive difference in the outcomes of our patients."

A cardiologist is responsible for diagnosing a heart condition through the examination of patient X-rays or an electrocardiogram (EKG), in addition to studying the patient's medical history. A cardiologist can also prescribe necessary medication, as well as recommend individually tailored activity and dietary programs. If a patient has a condition requiring surgery, the cardiologist is responsible for referring the patient to a heart surgeon.

But what does it take to be a cardiologist? The minimum educational requirement for entry into a medical school is three years of college, but most applicants have at least a bachelor's degree. There are 146 medical schools in the United States, and they require applicants to submit school transcripts, scores from the Medical College Admission Test (MCAT) and letters of recommendation. Students spend most of the first two years of medical school in

laboratories and classrooms, and the last two years working with patients in hospitals and clinics under the supervision of skilled physicians. They gain experience in several areas through rotations or by spending concentrated time in specialties such as internal medicine, obstetrics and gynecology, pediatrics, psychiatry and surgery.

Following four years of medical school, the physician completes three years in an internal medicine residency program, during which the resident is working under supervision at the hospital or clinic treating patients. The University of Cincinnati Medical Center offers one of the largest divisions of general internal medicine in the country. Residents are paid and provided with benefits. At the UC Medical Center a resident earns between \$41,000 and \$45,500 a year.

The physician will then complete a three-year fellowship program that specializes in cardiology, where the physician will work at a hospital or clinic seeing patients under the supervision of established cardiologists. There are 175 accredited cardiology fellowships programs in the United States.

Nationally there are approximately 2,061 active cardiology fellows. During their specialized training they may treat patients with heart disease, diabetes, and high cholesterol, as well as patients recovering from stroke, heart attack, and children with cardiovascular disease. Approximately 81 percent of cardiology fellows are male and 19 percent are female.

The University of Cincinnati offers a three-year accredited program for cardiology fellows. Fellows are paid and provided with benefits. The pay ranges from \$44,000 to \$49,000, depending on their year of training. There are approximately four cardiology fellowship slots each year at the University of Cincinnati Medical Center.
